

Chapter 3 Project



You are archaeologists in Egypt and you have just discovered a tomb that no one has ever seen before. Inside, you find a mummy. You realize that this mummy is an ancient pharaoh! Who is this mystery pharaoh?

Objective: Create the biography of an undiscovered pharaoh and describe what their tomb looks like. You will be presenting your discovery to a room full of esteemed archaeologists.

Requirements:

1) Write a short biography about your Pharaoh. It only needs to be 5-10 sentences.

- Was your Pharaoh a good or bad ruler?
- What was their biggest achievement?
- Did the people of Egypt like your Pharaoh?

Feel free to include other details, but the 3 mentioned above are required.

2) Create the sarcophagus (lid of the coffin) of your pharaoh.

-Include some hieroglyphics that describe a few features of your pharaoh, such as their name, their physical features, or something about their reign.

3) Share your findings with your classmates in a short, 3-5 minute presentation.

-Take turns with your partner and speak loudly and clearly. It is important that you include all of the required details and make eye contact with your classmates!
